New Zealand will mourn the death of **Queen Elizabeth II** with a one-off public holiday on **September 26**. The public holiday will be called "Queen Elizabeth II Memorial Day."

As you will be aware the Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern announced that Cabinet agreed to remove the COVID-19 Protection Framework. This means that household contacts of COVID-19 cases will no longer need to isolate, but instead should undertake a RAT test every day for 5 days. If you do test positive for COVID-19 you will still have to stay home and isolate for seven days.

**Mask wearing** is no longer strongly recommended. Although it is optional at Glendene School some staff are still choosing to wear masks inside. Staff who work closely with students may also ask students to wear masks. Students may also be asked to wear masks if they are coughing or have runny noses. On all other occasions it will be optional for students to wear masks.

**Sore throats matter**

A sore throat can lead to Rheumatic Fever if it's left untreated. Rheumatic fever is very serious and can cause heart damage.

- Every time your child has a sore throat it could be serious. Don't ignore it. Take them to a doctor or nurse straight away to have it checked.
- If you are given antibiotics, take them every day for 10 days.
- Stop the spread; wash your hands, cover your mouth when you cough or sneeze and avoid sharing drink bottles.

### Health – Sore throat

#### What to do if your child has a sore throat?

*(translation booklets are available from the school office in limited pacific languages)*

Every time your child has a sore throat take them to get their throat checked straight away. This could be at the doctor or nurse, or they may be at a school where this can be done. Don't wait to see if your child's throat gets better. They already may have 'strep throat' and it needs to get treated immediately. By treating sore throats early it can stop rheumatic fever from developing.

The doctor or nurse will check the throat and if it is 'strep throat' your child will need to take antibiotics for 10 days. It is important that your child takes all of the antibiotics to make sure they get rid of the infection and to stop getting rheumatic fever. Even if your child's throat feels better, they need to keep taking the antibiotics until they are all finished. If their throat is still sore after they have finished the antibiotics, make sure you take them back to see the doctor or nurse.
